The New Mexico Gaming Control Board, through the State Gaming Representative, monitors the 2001 and 2007 Tribal-State Class III Gaming Compacts signed by 14 New Mexico Tribes. These Tribes report "Net Win" and pay revenue share based on "Net Win" to the State of New Mexico on a quarterly basis. "Net Win" is the amount wagered on gaming machines, less the amount paid out in cash and non-cash prizes won on the gaming machines, less State and Tribal Regulatory Fees. "Net Win" is not the net profit of the casino. The total amount paid to the State Treasurer for revenue sharing by the Tribes operating casinos for the quarter ending **December 31, 2014** was **\$ 15,903,916**. This revenue is deposited into the General Fund of the State of New Mexico.
